
Campers love to eat, and Spring OPA 2023 will not disappoint.

Membership Database: The new FCRV membership database allows Regional, State & Provincial Directors to see the entire membership list as well as having the ability to filter out only their own respective State/Province. The numbers are seen "in real time" with no delays. Directors can make corrections in the "comment" section for the webmaster to change on the database.

We encourage our members to continue handing out the OPA Flyers and business cards that have been provided at the various campouts. There are more available, just ask for them.



Any parts that are proposed to be deleted have been crossed out, but you can still read what was previously there so you can determine whether or not you agree with each deletion. Any parts that are proposed to be added are highlighted in yellow to make them easy to find. Many parts have been "shelved" meaning they have been moved to the end of the document and could be "dusted off and reintroduced" at a later time.

Every OPA member should have received an email copy of these proposed amendments so that they may read them over and advise their voting delegate of their opinion. Voting delegates will have the final discussion and vote on these amendments at the May 21, 2023 voting delegates meeting in Harriston. Plan to be there.

Message from the Editor

Thank you to everyone who has sent an email, made a phone call, sent a Get Well card or said a prayer on my behalf during my recent surgery and recovery.

A diagnosis of Cancer strikes fear into even the bravest of people and it's worse if you're already settled in for the winter somewhere warm and sunny.

Thanks to the prayers of many, we had a safe trip home from southern Texas in early February. A series of tests were squeezed into the remaining weeks before the surgery date of March 3rd.

After a 5 hour surgery, I was left with only half of my colon, 6 incisions in my belly and a total of 26 staples. I was hospitalized for 6 days, then sent home for a 6 week recovery.

I am happy to report that I am improving at a steady rate. My stamina is not yet back to normal and so the publication of this edition of OPAction is later than I would have liked.

I encourage everyone to take a FIT test (fecal immunochemical test) for colon cancer. I had absolutely no symptoms and was not sick in any way. If not for the early detection of my cancerous polyp, it might not have been found until it was too late for treatment.
