



FCRV Media & Press Release Policy

Effective 09/11/2024

INTRODUCTION:

Family Campers and RVers' foundation is built on a storied history of uniting camping families in fellowship and service across the U.S. and Canada, and has its roots firmly planted in dedication to the support of wildlife preservation and environmental conservation. All members must strive to represent and market the organization in a professional manner.

An organizational media and press release policy should include the development of positive, consistent messages to be disseminated by an authorized spokesperson(s) versed on issues that are important to the organization. By having a media/press release policy and establishing a designated media contact(s), FCRV can avoid content inaccuracies and conflicting messages, control how FCRV events are reported to the public to promote organizational growth, and enhance its commercial partner marketability.

FCRV recognizes the importance of effectively communicating with the public and media to promote our mission, activities, and events. This policy outlines the guidelines for media interactions and public communications.

DESIGNATED SPOKESPERSONS

Only designated spokespersons are authorized to communicate with the media on behalf of FCRV. Those designated spokespersons are:

- President
- Vice President of Planning & Development (VPPD)
- Any other individual(s) specifically authorized by the President or VPPD as designee

MEDIA INQUIRIES

All media inquiries, including requests for interviews, statements, or information, must be directed to the VPPD, President, or designee. No other individuals are permitted to speak to the media on behalf of FCRV without prior approval.

MEDIA RELEASES AND PUBLICATIONS

All media releases, publications, newsletters, website content, social media posts, and other public communications representing FCRV must be reviewed and approved by the VPPD or President before distribution or publication.

CRISIS COMMUNICATIONS

In the event of a crisis or emergency situation, all media inquiries and communications will be handled by the President or designated representative. A crisis communications plan will be activated to ensure consistent and accurate messaging.

PERSONAL OPINIONS

When communicating with the media or expressing personal opinions in public forums, individuals must clearly state that they are not speaking on behalf of FCRV unless they have been explicitly authorized to do so.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Confidential information about FCRV, its members, or operations must not be disclosed to the media or public without proper authorization.

LOCAL AND REGIONAL RV SHOWS, FESTIVALS, FAIRS, & EVENTS

FCRV recognizes the importance of community events as opportunities to promote the organization, engage with potential members, and support the current marketing plan.

All club chapters representing FCRV at local, state/provincial, regional, national, and international events shall:

- Enthusiastically support and align with the organization's current marketing plan and messaging.
- Display only banners, signage, and materials that have been approved by the VPPD or designee.
- Distribute only authorized promotional materials, brochures, and information approved for dissemination.
- Chapters must obtain prior approval from the VPPD or designee before participating in or representing FCRV at any local or regional event.

Note: All event media contact, publications, releases, and materials for events must be approved by the VPPD or designee.

COMPLIANCE

All members, volunteers, and staff of FCRV are expected to comply with this media policy. Violations may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of membership or employment.

Nominations are being accepted for one half of Trustees (nationally elected officers) who will govern the operations of the Family Campers & RVers (FCRV) during the 2025/2027 term of office.

International President, Gerry Pfirsch has established a nominating committee of which I am the chair to find and vet suitable candidates for election. The deadline for nominations is December 15, 2024.

The positions to be elected are Vice President Planning and Development, and Comptroller who are voted by the membership. Vice President Operations is also up for election and is elected by the Executive Board and Advisory Council.

Message from the National Office

Adding a Second Email Address With The National Office

Over the last few years the National Office has been slowly adapting older physical systems or outdated computer systems it used and moved them into newer tech based cloud based systems that have allowed us to work more streamlined. One of these changes is a whole new membership database system.

Along with this new membership database system is the ability to add in more variables to track much needed info about our members. Previously our old systems only allowed us to track one email address per membership account. We now have the ability to have two email addresses per account and are asking you to submit that information. Please submit this information through your state/prov or regional directors which will give our leadership experience using the new systems. This is also a good time to check with your state/prov or regional directors that your current email you have on file is up to date.

Discord

National and our leadership has moved on from using Zoom as our go to product for Video Communication and moved over to using Discord. Along with using Discord as our main source of video communication comes a slew of other benefits that Zoom did not allow.

Discord is a FREE social media platform that allows users to communicate in real time using text, voice, and video through public or private servers. You can find servers for all types of hobbies, from anything like knitting, bee keeping, video games, or sports, to things that FCRV exhibits like camping, RVing, wildlife and conservation Your trustees, National Office and 'Camping Today' team have been using it for the last few months to test it out and get experience with using its features before we opened our server up to membership and the general public.

Discord, while giving us a platform for our leadership and members to communicate also comes with a MUCH needed benefit of moving FCRV into spaces used by younger generations. Discord has 3 options for using its services. Those options are a phone app, an app for pc/mac, or you can even access it right through a web browser. So it makes communication VERY easy and FAST with how accessible it is compared to Zoom.

Using Discord requires creating an account for it. Please make sure to take measures to log the name and password you create to reference logging back into it whenever needed. Also please keep in mind that the minimum age to create a Discord account is 13 years of age.

- NO CLIPART! The aspect of publishing a professional looking newsletter heavily frowns upon the use of clip art. As well as puts FCRV into copyright infringement issues. Overwhelming amounts of clipart gets sent to us that we can't use. Save yourself and our team, the time in dealing with it, by just not sending it to us, please.
- Thumbnail pictures are not usable, they are blurry when made big enough for social media or "Camping Today".

The deadline for each issue is the 1st of the month of issue. Eg: For an issue published on November 15th, the deadline for articles would be November 1st

James E. Ward Agricultural Center - New

'The Spirit of Friendship' at Campvention 2025 at the James E. Ward Agricultural Center will be FCRVers' and guests' destination July 20-26, 2025. The center is the home to the nationally acclaimed Wilson County Fair, the largest county fair in Tennessee. With seven uniquely appointed buildings that can accommodate crowd sizes ranging from 35 to 3000, four existing stages, and multiple green spaces, the facilities can host multiple break-out sessions, competitions, and happenings as part of festivals, fairs, and other large events, including Campvention 2025.

The Ward Agricultural Center's camping facilities can accommodate over 1,000 RVs in 12 sections—including electrical hookups—plus primitive (tent) camping sites, 4 dump sites, 3 bathhouses, and multiple entrances to accommodate large events and crowds. www.wilsoncountyfairgrounds.com

As a side note, Campvention 1993 was held at the facility. Some of you may have attended. The Family Campers & RVers (FCRV) d.b.a. name was introduced. The facilities have grown and improved, as noted above. The attendance was 2866 families.

In the middle of the grounds is Fiddler's Grove, a 60building historic village that shares life as it was during the settlement of Wilson County through the Industrial Age. Tour the century-old buildings that include "an original church, blacksmith shop, school house, general store, cobbler shop, train station, corn crib barn with farm equipment of days gone by. There's a model train museum filled with two rooms of trains, a caboose, and many more. The funeral home, hardware store, barber shop, and grocery store are indicative of late 1800s and early 1900s. Dear RV

Is winterizing my rig important? Not wanting to freeze!

Dear Not,

If you live in an area where the temperatures fall into the freezing range, then the short answer is yes! Here are some reasons that you might find helpful. Frozen and broken lines are expensive to repair. A small water leak can and will become costly as it causes long-term damage to the floor or superstructure. Water heaters will split when they freeze, and when the temperature goes back up, you will be working with water damage and possibly a mold issue in the long term. It is important to protect your investment.

Thanks for asking Dear RV

Dear RV,

My question: Is RV skirting an advantage in the winter? Does it help in any way? Thanks for your input, Drafty

Dear Drafty,

There are many options There are also many factors that play into the answer. If you are living in your RV in a cold climate, this would help with heating. If you are in a warm area, it might not be as large of an advantage. One thing it will definitely do is keep the wind from blowing under the rig and will ease the potential for frozen water lines.

If you are only at a space for a short stay, would it be worth the time to install and then remove a few days later? I would say for me it would not be worth the labor and time to do for short stays. However, on a long stay I would say the benefits in having RV skirting in place outweigh the labor.

The final answer depends on how long you are in the one spot and what type of weather is expected. Other considerations are what does your budget allow and what does the park allow. There are so many different types of products available. There are snap on, Velcro on, as well as more permanent types that are built on the site and fit to the RV. I have also seen an inflatable style that you inflate under your rig.


Membership 50 Years or Longer
