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

I extend to each of you Holiday Greetings and would like to share the Joy of the Season with you and your household. May Blessings Abound in your home through this Season and The Year to come.



FCRV Media & Press Release Policy

Effective 09/11/2024 Revised 11/12/2024



INTRODUCTION

Family Campers and RVers' foundation is built on a storied history of uniting camping families in fellowship and service across the U.S. and Canada, and has its roots firmly planted in dedication to the support of wildlife preservation and environmental conservation. All members must strive to represent and market the organization in a professional manner.

An organizational media and press release policy should include the development of positive, consistent messages to be disseminated by an authorized spokesperson(s) versed on issues that are important to the organization. By having a media/press release policy and establishing a designated media contact(s), FCRV can avoid content inaccuracies and conflicting messages, control how FCRV events are reported to the public to promote organizational growth, and enhance its commercial partner marketability.

FCRV recognizes the importance of effectively communicating with the public and media to promote our mission, activities, and events. This policy outlines the guidelines for media interactions and public communications.

DESIGNATED SPOKESPERSONS

Only designated spokespersons are authorized to communicate with the media on behalf of FCRV. Those designated spokespersons are:

- President
- Vice President of Planning & Development (VPPD)
- Any other individual(s) specifically authorized by the President or VPPD as designee

MEDIA INQUIRIES

All media inquiries, including requests for interviews, statements, or information, must be directed to the VPPD, President, or designee. No other individuals are permitted to speak to the media on behalf of FCRV without prior approval.

MEDIA RELEASES AND PUBLICATIONS

FCRV is committed to maintaining a consistent, professional image through its messaging and branding. All media releases, publications, newsletters, website content, social media posts, and other public communications representing FCRV must meet the following criteria:

- Portray the organization in a professional and positive manner.
- Avoid political, religious, or editorial content that could be perceived as negative or critical towards the international organization or its leadership.

Failure to comply may result in pre-publication review and approval by the VPPD, President, or designee for a specified period.

CRISIS COMMUNICATIONS

In the event of a crisis or emergency situation, all media inquiries and communications will be handled by the President or designated representative. A crisis communications plan will be activated to ensure consistent and accurate messaging.

PERSONAL OPINIONS

When communicating with the media or expressing personal opinions in public forums, individuals must clearly state that they are not speaking on behalf of FCRV unless they have been explicitly authorized to do so.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Confidential information about FCRV, its members, or operations must not be disclosed to the media or public without proper authorization.

LOCAL AND REGIONAL RV SHOWS, FESTIVALS, FAIRS, & EVENTS

FCRV recognizes the importance of community events as opportunities to promote the organization, engage with potential members, and support the current marketing plan.

All club chapters representing FCRV at local, state/provincial, regional, national, and international events shall:

- Enthusiastically support and align with the organization's current marketing plan and messaging.
- Display only banners, signage, and materials that have been approved by the VPPD or designee.
- Distribute only authorized promotional materials, brochures, and information approved for dissemination.
- Chapters must obtain prior approval from the VPPD or designee before participating in or representing FCRV at any local or regional event.

Note: All event media contact, publications, releases, and materials for events must be approved by the VPPD or designee.

COMPLIANCE

All members, volunteers, and staff of FCRV are expected to comply with this media policy. Violations may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of membership or employment.



Put a 'Spring in your Step' and get ready to play games at the rally in Dothan, Alabama. We are going to feature some of the table games this month. Those table games you have come to enjoy will be played. You can look forward to enjoying 5 Crowns, Mexican Train Dominoes, Card Bingo, and Euchre. As always tables are available for you to gather with friends to play other games.

Card Bingo. This game is played with regular decks of cards. A group of 4 players share one deck of cards. The deck is dealt to each player until all cards are dealt. The caller has his own regular deck. The caller will draw a card from his deck and call it. All players who have that card remove it from their set of cards. When all cards are removed, the player calls Bingo! There are prizes for all winners.

Another very popular table game is 5 Crowns. It is a card game played with a special deck that has 5 suites (the extra one is stars). Played similarly to rummy you are making sets of the same number or runs of consecutive numbers in the same suite. The object is to be the first to play all your cards in the round and score zero points for the round. Other players can play their sets or runs with cards remaining in their hand scoring points. There are 11 rounds starting with 3 cards and building to 13. At the end of the game, you want to have the lowest score.

We have plenty of decks for both of these games, just come with a fun spirit. We will teach anyone who hasn't played before.



Visit Auburn, Alabama - New By Barb Turner, Rally Publicity Chair

Auburn, Alabama is a day-trip north of Dothan, site of the 53rd FCRV International Retiree Rally March 24-30, 2025.

Auburn is the largest city in eastern Alabama and is an historic college town, the home of Auburn University. The first settler arrived in the winter of 1836. A mere three years later Auburn was incorporated. By the mid-1840s, separate academies for boys and girls were established. The academies led to planter class families moving to Auburn in the 1840s and 1850s. Interestingly, by 1858 there were about 1000 free residents in Auburn, half of them were students. In 1858, the state legislature chartered a Methodist college, the East Alabama Male College in Auburn. This college, now Auburn University, opened its doors in 1859, offering a classical and liberal education.

"With the advent of the Civil War in 1861, Auburn quickly emptied. All of the schools closed, and most businesses shuttered. Auburn was the site of a hospital for Texan Confederate soldiers, but only saw direct combat with the raids of Rousseau in 1864 and Wilson in 1865.

"After the Civil War, Auburn's economy entered a prolonged depression that would last the remainder of the century. Public schools did not reopen until the mid-1870s, and most businesses remained closed. A series of fires in the 1860s and 1870s gutted the downtown area. East Alabama Male College was turned over to the state in 1872, and with funds from the federal Morrill Act was renamed Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical College with a new mission as a land grant college. Passage of the Hatch Act in 1887 allowed for expansion of agricultural research facilities on campus.

"In 1892, the college became the first four-year college in Alabama to admit women. This, combined with increased interest in scientific agriculture and engineering and new funding from business licenses, allowed the city to start expanding again. By 1910, Auburn's population had returned to its antebellum level. SIAA Conference championships won by the Auburn college's football team brought attention and support to Auburn, and helped fill the city's coffers. Today, Auburn's economy is centered on Auburn University and its affiliated services."





Visit Bowling Green, Kentucky - New By Barb Turner, Campvention Publicity Chair

Bowling Green, Kentucky is 50 miles north of Campvention 2025 at Lebanon, Tennessee on I-65. It is the county seat of Warren County and the third most populated city in Kentucky. https://www.visitbgky.com/

"Some controversy exists over the source of the town's name. The city refers to the first county commissioners' meeting (1798), which named the town 'Bolin Green' after the Bowling Green in New York City, where patriots had pulled down a statue of King George III and used the lead to make bullets during the American Revolution. According to the Encyclopedia of Kentucky, the name was derived from Bowling Green, Virginia, whence early migrants had come, or the personal 'ball alley game' of founder Robert Moore.

By 1810, Bowling Green had 154 residents. Growth in steamboat commerce and the proximity of the Barren River increased Bowling Green's prominence. In 1821, the Kentucky Legislature built a toll road between the town and Cloverport on the Ohio River. Canal locks and dams on the Barren River made it much more navigable. In 1832, the first portage railway connected the river to the location of the current county courthouse. Mules pulled freight and passengers to and from the city on the tracks.

"In 1859, the Louisville and Nashville Railroad (currently CSX Transportation) laid a railroad through Bowling Green that connected the city with northern and southern markets. Bowling Green declared itself neutral in an attempt to escape the Civil War. Because of its prime location and resources, however, both the Union and Confederacy sought control of the city. The majority of its residents rejected both the Confederacy and the Lincoln administration. On September 18, 1861, around 1,300 Confederate soldiers arrived from Tennessee to occupy the city, placed under command of Kentucky native General Simon Bolivar Buckner. The city's pro-Union feelings surprised the Confederate occupiers. The Confederates fortified surrounding hills to secure possible military approaches to the valuable river and railroad assets. In November 1861, the provisional Confederate government of Kentucky chose Bowling Green as its capital.

"On February 14, 1862, after receiving reports that Fort Henry on the Tennessee River and Fort Donelson on the Cumberland River had both been captured by Union forces under Ulysses S. Grant, the Confederates began to withdraw from Bowling Green. They destroyed bridges across the Barren River, the railroad depot, and other important buildings that could be used by the enemy. The city was subject to disruptions and raids throughout the remainder of the war. During the summer of 1864, Union General Stephen G. Burbridge arrested 22 civilians in and around Bowling Green on a charge of treason. This incident and other harsh treatment by federal authorities led to bitterness toward the Union among Bowling Green residents and increased sympathies with the Confederacy.

"After the Civil War, Bowling Green's business district grew considerably. Previously, agriculture had dominated the city's economy. During the 1870s, many of the historic business structures seen today were erected. One of the most important businesses in Bowling Green of this era was Carie Burnam Taylor's dress-making company. By 1906, Taylor employed more than 200 women."

Jumping ahead to the 21st century, several manufacturers, including General Motors, Spalding, and Fruit of the Loom, have established manufacturing facilities in Bowling Green. All Corvettes have been built in Bowling Green since 1981. It is also the home of Western Kentucky University and the National Corvette Museum

The 2016 FCRV Travalong visited the Corvette Museum (350 Corvette Dr), and the assembly line. Those participants would encourage you to visit both facilities.

On February 12, 2014 at 5:39 AM a sinkhole occurred in the Corvette Museum Skydome. \$5 million worth of classic Corvettes fell in the 30' hole. Today, the glass floor allows visitors to see into the sinkhole. The Travalong members were in awe of both the museum and the attention to detail seen along the Corvette assembly line. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9ccOrwFs3No Want to experience driving a Corvette? Another interesting fact: Camping World began in Bowling Green!! "Camping World began in 1966 with a small store in Beech Bend Park, an amusement park outside of Bowling Green, Kentucky, which billed its campground as the world's largest. Campers at the park were requesting a store where they could buy supplies, so David Garvin—son of the park's owner—took out a loan and opened the store. Garvin amassed a large customer list as the years went by, which proved to be sagacious later when he added a mail-order division to the company. That division thrived, fueling the company's growth for years to come."

The 1984 NCHA Campvention was held in Beech Bend Park! The highlight? President Ronald Reagan visited and spoke to the assembled attendees!!

Do your own searches for things to see and do in Bowling Green, Kentucky. You'll probably decide that there is just too much to see in a day-trip from Campvention. Plan on spending a couple of days prior to or after.
















Event Schedule & Recaps




