



#### NCHA/FCRV Hank Nathan Scholarship 2025 Greetings from your Hank Nathan Scholarship Team

This month's article shares important information for those of you interested in applying for our NCHA/FCRV HANK NATHAN NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP. Requests for applications will be posted in the December Camping Today. Portal submission deadline closes on May 1, 2025.

High School Graduates and College Enrollees as well as Trade School and part time Students are encouraged to apply based on the criteria listed.

We suggest you start gathering the information requested in a timely manner.

Who Can Apply: Any FCRV member or their dependent children planning to enroll or are currently enrolled in an undergraduate, graduate, post-graduate or trade school, may apply for an FCRV scholarship. An applicant must be a member for at least 18 full calendar months before application and in good standing. Dependent children of members applying under their parent/guardian's membership must be a dependent thereof for the year of the scholarship award, and be eligible as an income tax deduction.

#### Scholarship Considerations Overview:

1.High School and College students must have at least a 2.3 grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 point scale submitted from their transcript.

2. Consideration is taken for GPA, maturity, leadership, related activities, and goals of the candidate as related to the objectives of FCRV.

3. This is a non-competitive Scholarship. A scoring grid will be used to determine awards and their values.

#### How to Apply:

Applications will only be accepted online. The application MUST include the FCRV member holder's name, membership number, postal mailing address, and, most importantly, an email address at which the applicant can be contacted. Pay special attention to the entire website and follow the directions closely.

#### Applications must include the following:

1. A current, complete transcript of grades. Grade reports are not accepted. Transcripts must display student name, school name, grades, credit hours for each course, and term in which course was taken.

2. Two online recommendation letters are required, both may be from FCRV members, not related to each other or to you(can be a trustee, regional director, state director, district director, or any member who is not related). Or, one of your two recommendations may come from a school principal, coach, band director, club supervisor etc. or your immediate supervisor if you are working. Your application will be complete when all required materials are submitted electronically by May 1st.

3. High School and Full Time College Students: You should have at least a 2.3 grade point average on a 4.0 point scale submitted from your transcript.

4. Part-time, and Trade School Students: You must be enrolled with the equivalent of 6 credit hours. You will be evaluated accordingly. Scholarships are for one year. Recipients may reapply for a scholarship each year they meet the eligibility requirements.

5. The Schuh Award recognizes applicants who major, minor, or explore elective classes in fields related to Forestry, Conservation, Ecology, or Outdoor Education.

The Annual Scholarship budget is based on 6% of the Scholarship Account for the previous calendar year. Applicants' scores will be tallied. Stipends will then be awarded to those whose application meets the scoring standards set in advance by the scoring team. Annual Scholarships awarded carry a stipend ranging from \$1,000 to \$4,000.

The Scholarship Board of Directors present the awards at, or after, the Annual General meeting held at Campvention.

Applicants receiving an award must submit a headshot of themselves, along with an education bio. These will be posted in Camping Today so that the members who donate to the scholarship fund can see who is getting the FCRV Scholarships. These items must be received after notification from the scholarship committee and prior to the award being given to your school. A thank you in Camping Today would be nice.

FCRV Media & Press Release Policy

#### Effective 09/11/2024 Revised 11/12/2024

#### INTRODUCTION

Family Campers and RVers' foundation is built on a storied history of uniting camping families in fellowship and service across the U.S. and Canada, and has its roots firmly planted in dedication to the support of wildlife preservation and environmental conservation. All members must strive to represent and market the organization in a professional manner.

An organizational media and press release policy should include the development of positive, consistent messages to be disseminated by an authorized spokesperson(s) versed on issues that are important to the organization. By having a media/press release policy and establishing a designated media contact(s), FCRV can avoid content inaccuracies and conflicting messages, control how FCRV events are reported to the public to promote organizational growth, and enhance its commercial partner marketability.

FCRV recognizes the importance of effectively communicating with the public and media to promote our mission, activities, and events. This policy outlines the guidelines for media interactions and public communications.

#### DESIGNATED SPOKESPERSONS

Only designated spokespersons are authorized to communicate with the media on behalf of FCRV. Those designated spokespersons are:

- President
- Vice President of Planning & Development (VPPD)
- Any other individual(s) specifically authorized by the President or VPPD as designee

#### **MEDIA INQUIRIES**

All media inquiries, including requests for interviews, statements, or information, must be directed to the VPPD, President, or designee. No other individuals are permitted to speak to the media on behalf of FCRV without prior approval.

#### MEDIA RELEASES AND PUBLICATIONS

FCRV is committed to maintaining a consistent, professional image through its messaging and branding. All media releases, publications, newsletters, website content, social media posts, and other public communications representing FCRV must meet the following criteria:

- Portray the organization in a professional and positive manner.

- Avoid political, religious, or editorial content that could be perceived as negative or critical towards the international organization or its leadership.

Failure to comply may result in pre-publication review and approval by the VPPD, President, or designee for a specified period.

#### **CRISIS COMMUNICATIONS**

In the event of a crisis or emergency situation, all media inquiries and communications will be handled by the President or designated representative. A crisis communications plan will be activated to ensure consistent and accurate messaging.

#### PERSONAL OPINIONS

When communicating with the media or expressing personal opinions in public forums, individuals must clearly state that they are not speaking on behalf of FCRV unless they have been explicitly authorized to do so.

#### CONFIDENTIALITY

Confidential information about FCRV, its members, or operations must not be disclosed to the media or public without proper authorization.

#### LOCAL AND REGIONAL RV SHOWS, FESTIVALS, FAIRS, & EVENTS

FCRV recognizes the importance of community events as opportunities to promote the organization, engage with potential members, and support the current marketing plan.

All club chapters representing FCRV at local, state/provincial, regional, national, and international events shall:

- Enthusiastically support and align with the organization's current marketing plan and messaging.
- Display only banners, signage, and materials that have been approved by the VPPD or designee.
- Distribute only authorized promotional materials, brochures, and information approved for dissemination.
- Chapters must obtain prior approval from the VPPD or designee before participating in or representing FCRV at any local or regional event.

Note: All event media contact, publications, releases, and materials for events must be approved by the VPPD or designee.

#### COMPLIANCE

All members, volunteers, and staff of FCRV are expected to comply with this media policy. Violations may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of membership or employment.



#### Visit Troy, Alabama - New By Barb Turner

The early days at the 2025 FCRV Retiree Rally (March 21-23, 2025) will provide you time to explore. Over the next few issues places of possible interest will be shared for your consideration.

Fifty-one miles northeast of Dothan is Troy, Alabama. Football fans will recognize the university which calls Troy home, Troy University. (<u>https://www.troy.edu/</u>) (<u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IIKA7eIZeiM</u>) Those who wanted to avoid I-75 to Florida may have taken I-65 through Troy as we did a couple of times. Did you stop to visit? Did you explore Troy and the area? If not, the rally early days will give you that opportunity.

What we know as Troy was the home of various Native American tribes for centuries. With the arrival of Europeans, present-day Alabama was claimed by Spain, France, and Great Britain. "Originally known as Deer Stand Hill (an Indian hunting ground), which was first settled about 1824, it was later known as Zebulon and then Centreville before being renamed Troy in 1838. Troy became the county seat that same year after a new county courthouse was built in the city, replacing the previous county seat town of Monticello." <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Troy, Alabama</u>



A Jack Daniels Distillery Bus Tour complete with premium Tennessee whiskey tastings is available for about \$120. Nashville's Dark Secrets: Murder & True Crime Walking Ghost Tour for adults only is about \$35 a person for those who love ghosts, history, and especially true crime. Finally, Outdoor Escape Room in Nashville - Downtown from \$75.00 per group of up to 6. This is one part scavenger hunt, one part escape room, and one part urban crawl. Can you escape your city? Search for real-world clues, solve puzzles, and discover your city with an experience you will never forget! Some expressed interest in these tours at Campvention in New York. The donations are then used for Wildlife Grants. The program awards grants to many worthwhile wildlife conservation projects in the U.S. and Canada. These grants may be applied for through the National Family Campers & RVers Wildlife Director. Wildlife Grants may be mailed by USPS or emailed, fcrvwildlifedir@gmail.com, to the National Wildlife Directors by May 20. The grant application, the organization's proof of 501(c)3 status, and a letter from the organization must be mailed along with any other supporting documents that you feel will help the program get a better understanding about the organization."



#### Visit Lebanon, Tennessee - New By Barb Turner, Campvention Publicity Chair

Lebanon, Tennessee is the site of Campvention 2025 July 20-26, 2025. Lebanon hosted Campvention 1993 when d.b.a. Family Campers & RVers was introduced. Lebanon and NCHA/FCRV have changed over the intervening years. If you attended in 1993, explore Lebanon and see the changes. If Lebanon is new to you, plan to explore our host city.

Lebanon was established in 1802 on an overland stagecoach route and was named for the biblical Lebanon which has an abundance of cedar trees. In the area stands of junipers were mistaken for cedars by the early settlers. It developed as a trading center for livestock and farm products. Lebanon was the scene of several minor skirmishes during the Civil War, mainly during 1862.

Cracker Barrel Restaurants: "The company's headquarters are in Lebanon, Tennessee, where Cracker Barrel was founded by Dan Evins and Tommy Lowe in 1969. The chain's early locations were positioned near Interstate Highway exits in the Southeastern and Midwestern United States but expanded across the country during the 1990s and 2000s." <u>https://www.crackerbarrel.com/about</u>

Lebanon is also the home of Cumberland University, a small private liberal arts university founded in 1842. <u>https://www.cumberland.edu/</u>

Be the tourist while in Lebanon for Campvention by starting at Fiddlers Grove Historic Village as noted in the October issue of Camping Today. The historic village is located on the Campvention site, James E. Ward Agricultural Center.

Visit Silver Ridge Pottery, 3712 Chicken Rd, one of America's favorite potters.

Cedars of Lebanon State Park, 328 Cedar Forest Rd, features the cedar glades and its unique ecosystem that has acclimated to the thin soil layers or no soil.

Lebanon History Museum, 200 N Castle Heights Avenue, is a Lebanon 'must-visit.' Several galleries in the museum tell stories of the city's humble but promising beginnings. https://thetouristchecklist.com/things-to-do-inlebanon-tn/

Wilson County Veterans Museum, 304 East Main Street, is "dedicated to veterans of all conflicts and features a treasure trove of artifacts from World War I & II, Korea, Vietnam, and Desert Storm. The crown jewel of the museum is a UH-1 Helicopter better known as a "Huey." American soldiers who fought in the Vietnam War between 1966-68 flew in the helicopter. You can see many of the bullet holes from intense combat. And from 1980-95, it was used by members of the Tennessee Army National Guard in a variety of missions."



#### Dear RV.

It is the time of year many are putting the rig away for the winter. It is time for us to look at the things we need to do so that we are ready for Spring. Winterization is at the top of the list. This is a top priority in cold areas. This is also a good time to look the rig over and do things like check the roof and set up any cleaning, recaulking, you know, the general maintenance things that we don't have time to do when we are camping. It is also a very good time to evaluate the tires on the rig. Make sure that they are aired up. Look them over. Are they showing wear? Are they showing any cracks, gouges, or damage to the side walls? Checking them now will give you a head start on the next camping year and possibly not delay its start if they need replacement. It is a good time to check over the roof for trouble spots. Look for cracks in the caulking. Also , look for holes or small tears and the like. This will ensure the longevity of the rig. It is also a perfect time to check the battery. Check the water level in the battery. Do you need to remove it from the rig and store it to protect it from freezing? Or ,are you lucky and able to keep a battery minder on it in storage? If storing is a damp area, don't forget to place moisture removing, of your choice, to reduce the chance for mildew. Above all, don't forget to protect the water system from freezing. Some use RV anti-freeze in the system. Some simply blow the water system out with air removing all water, thus no broken pipes. Use the method that you find best for your rig and situation. Many choose to have an RV Dealer winterize the water system. No matter the method, simply make sure it is winterized and ready for winter.

#### Dear RV.

We have a cargo door on the 5th wheel that comes open during travel. What could we do? Thanks

Without knowing the type of latch on the door, it is hard to say what the cause is. One of the common things that could be causing this is the latch is just a little loose and the vibration of the road causes it to unlatch. You might be able to simply tighten the screws holding the latch in the door and correct the issue. One way to check this would be to open the cargo door, take the latch in your hands on both sides of the latch, and give it a gentle pull back and forth. If the latch moves in the door, this could be the problem. Another possibility is the latch is wellsecured but slightly out of alignment and needs to be adjusted. Adjust so it gives you a secure latch.

I hope this helps with the cargo door! There is nothing worse than having things fall out while going down the road!
