Government-issued I.D. was checked by onsite Security prior to allowing the visitors to board the bus for the guided tour of the compound. Campers were allowed see, from the bus, the Nuclear Reactor Building, the Nuclear Waste Storage facilities, and many other buildings and structures.

Once everyone passed the security check, they assembled in the theatre for a comprehensive video which gave the history of the organization as well as an explanation of how nuclear power works and how the waste is managed & regulated.

International News



- 1. All future **Membership Renewal** notices will be via email. Three notices will be sent. It is important that the International office has your correct email.
- All chapters have been directed by the Trustees to conduct a review of their Constitution & By-laws by Oct.1, 2025. Any changes must be approved by the Prov. Dir. and then sent to the VP of Operations.
- 3. Only events submitted through the FCRV portal on the website will be eligible for Certificates of Insurance.
- International Elections were held in April. Results are as follows;
 V.P. Of planning & Development—Daniel Tinter
 Comptroller—Sandi Wingert
 V.P. Of Operations—Linda English
- Due to budget constraints, one part time staff will be eliminated July 1, 2025. Therefore, there will be no assistance from International office to follow-up with any dropped or new members.
- 6. **FCRV Waiver of Liability**: Beginning with CV 2025, one person/membership will be required to sign a Waiver of Liability. This annual requirement will soon be found on the website.
- Campvention 2025 in Lebanon, Tennessee: Trustees have extended a discount to all Canadians due to the difference in the exchange rate. Canadians can pay \$250 U.S. (instead of \$350 US). Any Canadian who has already paid the \$350 US will be given free "early bird" days instead.
- 8. Campvention 2026 will be held in South Dakota.
- 9. **New Member Booklet:** A detailed online booklet is available for new members which outlines the history, programs & scheduled events.
