Elimination of Program Certificates

Hello FCRV Members,

During the February 15, 2026, Trustee Board Meeting, it was decided to eliminate the use of the Program Certificates.

This decision came about because the Certificates are an unknown financial liability as well as a to-do item for all the Program Directors. As you can imagine, if someone saves up their certificates and then uses them as intended to purchase an item from a vendor or towards their Campvention fee, FCRV then pays that vendor those amounts. Since FCRV is watching every penny, we are deciding to eliminate the certificates to avoid those surprising expenses.

Since we seem to have lots of these certificates sitting around, we are issuing this notice to allow you all sufficient time to use those well-deserved certificates. We really hope you use them while attending the 2026 or 2027 Campvention or towards the 2026 / 2027 Campvention registration fees.

The Certificates will no longer be printed and issued effective March 15, 2026.

You will then have until the end of the 2027 Campvention event, which is currently set to end on July 17, 2027, to use up all your Program Certificates.

We all hope you understand the need for this change and hope you enjoy the use of your Certificates!

Important Membership Dues Update

After extensive discussion among the Executive Board and Advisory Council, FCRV has approved an increase in annual dues. For at least the past 15 years, reserve funds have been used to cover annual operating expenses. While this approach allowed us to avoid increasing dues, it is no longer sustainable.

Even with the adjustment, the new dues rate will not fully cover our operating costs. However, increasing dues at this time is essential to keep FCRV financially solvent and able to continue serving its members. **It has been approximately 15 years since the last dues increase**, and we will continue to regularly evaluate dues and expenses going forward.

In addition to this change, we will actively pursue non-dues revenue opportunities to support long-term financial stability. The trustees are working diligently to ensure the organization's future, and we ask for the same level of commitment from our members.

Effective March 1, 2026:

- Annual dues will be **\$52** (equivalent to **\$1.00 per week**).
- Multiple-year discounts will no longer be offered; however, members may renew for multiple years at the rate of **\$52 per year**.
- Dues payments will be accepted **online only**, as part of a cost-saving and streamlining initiative.
- The six-month free bonus for new members is being discontinued; however, this change does not preclude the development and implementation of new, more tailored incentives or promotional offerings in the future as part of a more strategic and targeted membership approach.

We continue to evaluate every expense carefully. We appreciate your ongoing support, trust your commitment to FCRV, and welcome your input as we move forward together.

Note: Current dues rates will remain available for renewal until **February 28, 2026**.

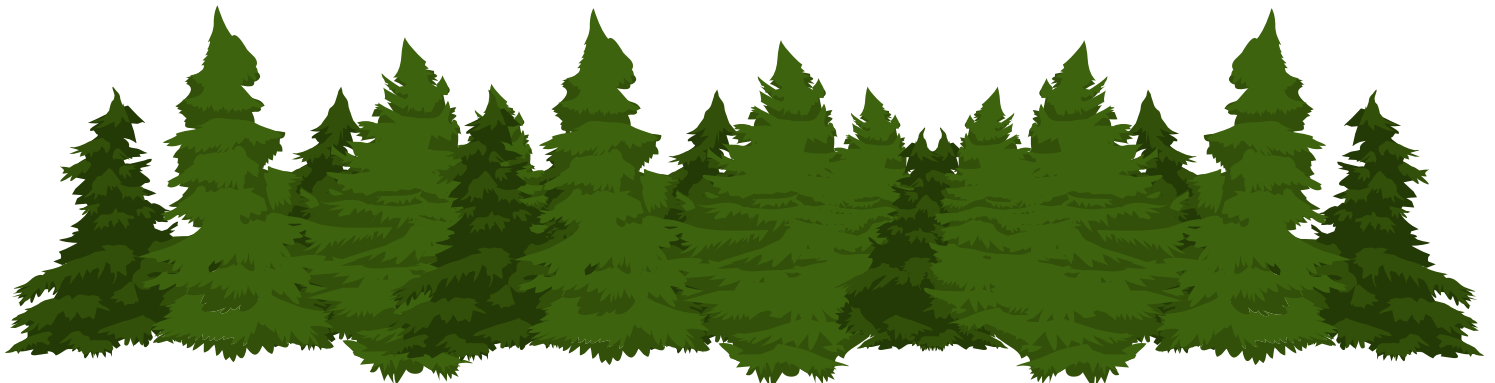

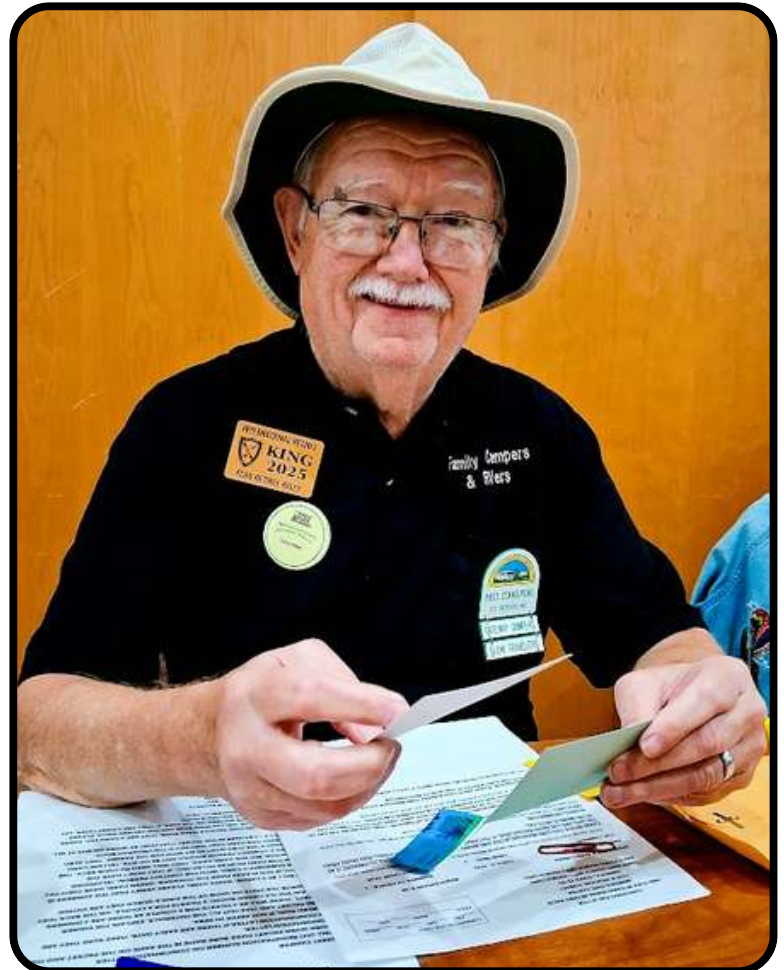

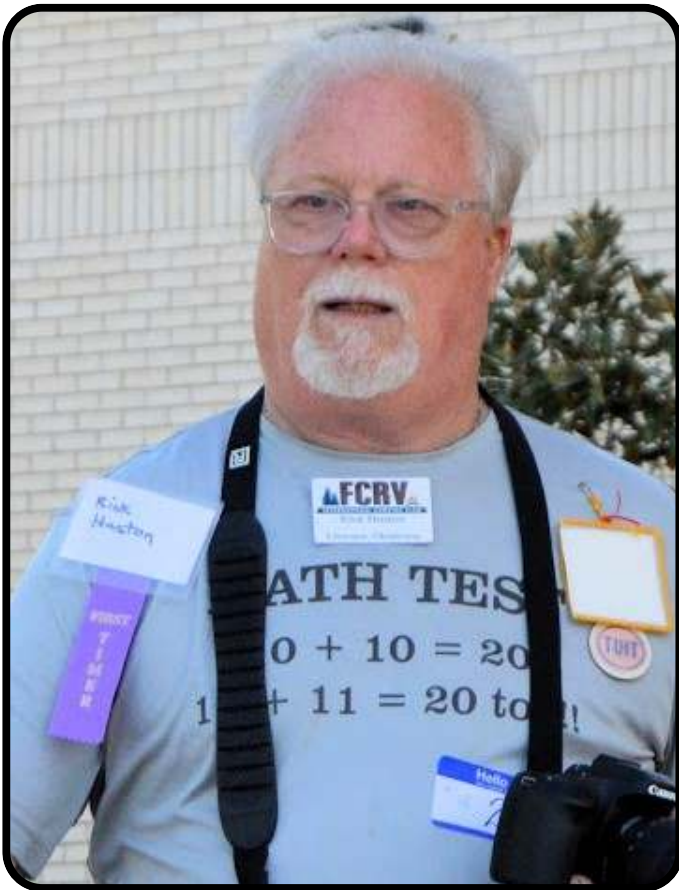
Our second meeting was a recap. We talked, questions were answered or answers were found. They all enjoyed the week; always too much to do, but they truly are ready to return as second timers next year.

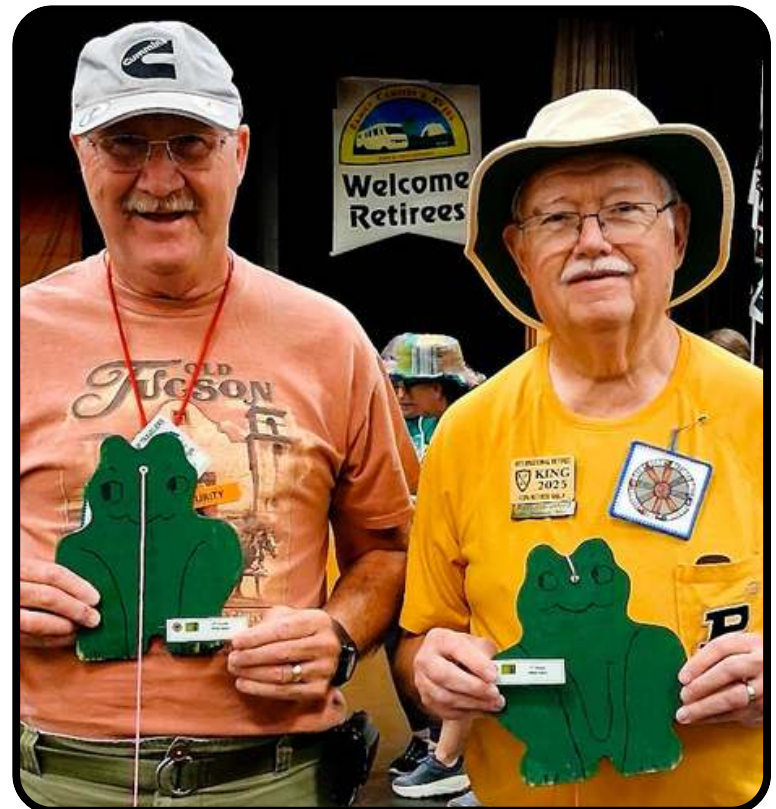
SkipBo - 6 players, many who were new to the game. No prizes awarded.

Campground Protocol



Campground Protocol

After hours of travel, you arrive at the campground, register, and set up your site. The kids run around, the dog chases them, the awning is up, lights are plugged in, and campground rules sit forgotten. This is **not** the ideal example of FCRV camping etiquette.

Let's take a better approach:

- **Know the rules:** Review campground regulations with everyone in your group. Teach kids to stay on roads or paths, wear helmets on bikes, and avoid other campsites. Nighttime should be spent at your own site unless attending campground activities. Use polite language at all times.
- **Manage pets responsibly:** Keep your dog secured or leashed, clean up after them, provide food and water, and have medical records ready. Avoid excessive barking.
- **Use lights thoughtfully:** Turn off awning and exterior lights at night to save electricity and avoid disturbing neighbors. Sleep is healthier in the dark.
- **Control noise:** Keep music and conversation at a reasonable level. Sound should not travel more than 15 feet from your site. Be considerate during late-night gatherings.
- **Handle trash properly:** Follow campground procedures for trash collection. Leave your site, including the fire ring, cleaner than you found it.
- **Respect parking and guests:** Ensure extra vehicles don't block roads or damage green spaces. Guests may need to park elsewhere.
- **Use dump stations safely:** Be patient, allow space for others, and avoid risky maneuvers. Safety is more important than speed.

Camping should be enjoyable for everyone. Following simple rules, showing respect, and practicing kindness ensures a safe, fun experience for your group and your neighbors. Happy camping!

Outdoor fun season is arriving. So de-winterize your camper or air out your tent, and start packing and get ready for a new camping season.

Do you have some outside activities that you like to do while you are camping? One of our favorite activities is to go riding on an ATV or UTV. In case you are not familiar with those terms, they are:

ATV is an All Terrain Vehicle for a single person and is steered with handlebars for recreation and tight trails.

UTV is a Utility Task Vehicle which is larger and seats 2 people side-by-side with a steering wheel, can have additional seating for more people and cargo beds.

We have a UTV, and my husband Joe and I love to travel trails all over the Colorado mountains. We have climbed very steep trails, forded rivers with water almost over our tires, did rock climbing, traversed thick mud puddles with mud over the tires, rode on trails no wider than our tires with sheer drop offs, have been known to have to use a winch on occasion and all along with just simple trail riding. The scenery is spectacular, and we generally see all kinds of wildlife from the trails.

One of our very favorite places to go is Taylor Park Reservoir. It is a 2000-acre Colorado destination. It offers fishing, boating, camp ground, and BLM lands. They have campgrounds where you can get full hookups or you can boondock anywhere. There are miles and miles of OHV riding (Off Highway Vehicles)

trails. They also offer northern pike, rainbow trout, and kokanee salmon fishing. There are extensive trails for hiking and mountain biking, along with the OHV trails.

We like to take our little 17' travel trailer and our UTV on a trailer to Taylor Park, boondock camp, and ride our UTV many days in a row. We generally are camping with like-minded people, so the week is spent camping and ATV/UTV riding trails. It is very enjoyable.

We use an app that shows all the OHV trails in Colorado. It is called COTREX. That stands for Colorado Trail Explorer. We can pick the trails we would like to ride, and it keeps track of our progress along the trails.

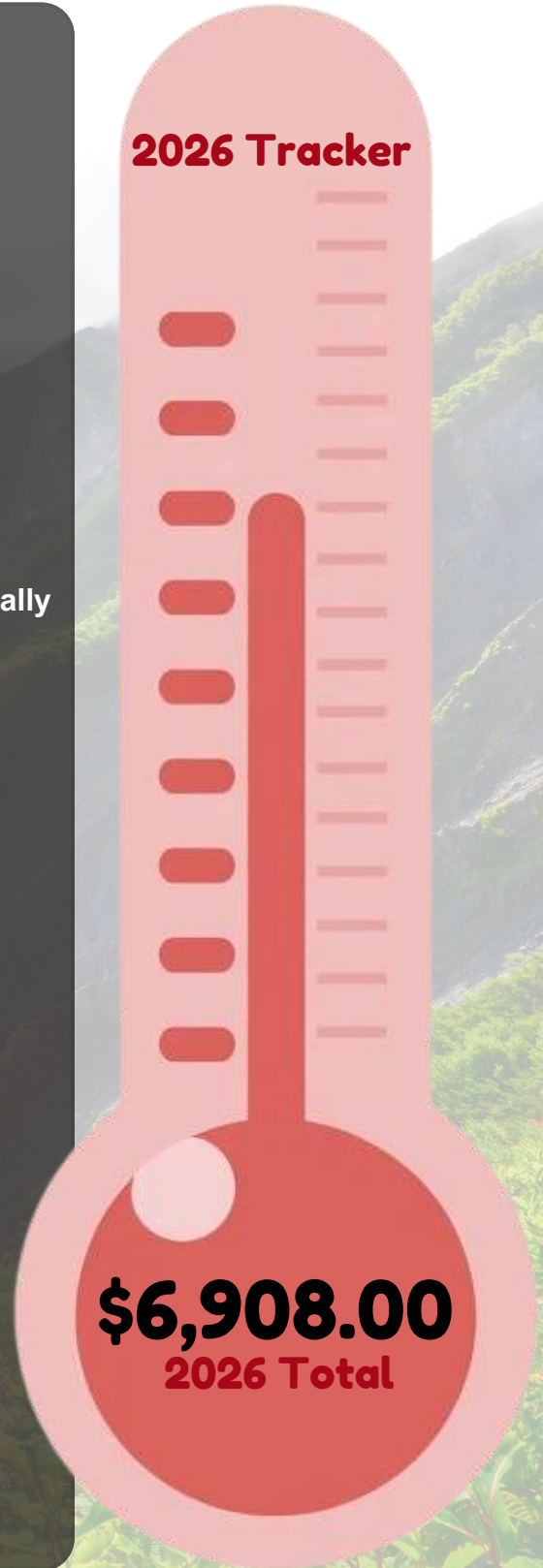
